Why we want you

Local people know their local Rights of Way Network intimately, as a Parish Path Liaison Officer (PPLO) you will volunteer with Somerset County Council's Rights of Way team but also be involved with your local Parish or Town Council. This is an important local role where you will help us respond to issues on your local network, whilst ensuring the local community is kept up to date with what is happening on their local Rights of Way and across the county.

What you will be doing

- Carry out minor vegetation clearance around stiles, gates signposts etc
- Record any problems reported by the local community/users on the rights of way network to us via the Explore Somerset mapping
- Respond to issues raised through the Explore Somerset Map and inform the Area Wardens of your findings
- Help us to identify local landowners
- Ensure a map showing all the Rights of Way in the area is available for the local community
- Inform the local council on any work that has been undertaken on the Rights of Way
- Produce an annual report on the parish network
- Promote responsible use of the Public Rights of Way network by observing the Countryside Code
- Record the hours you spend volunteering
